## Matthew 4:19-20 Taking the First Step...Again!

My Brother-in-Law Dennis recently shared with me this story. One evening, he attended an award ceremony at a nearby martial arts studio. During the evening, newly-achieved belts were handed out to students who had demonstrated the technical ability and discipline to move from the white belt, which represents the first step of their journey, to their ultimate goal of earning a black belt. As the ceremony wrapped up, one of the students asked the chief instructor "Sir, what belt is the most difficult to earn?" All of those gathered assumed that his answer would be the black belt, but much to their surprise, he replied confidently, "the white belt." They were confused as the white belt is not really earned. It is simply given, along with other gear, to all students when they step into the studio for their first initial karate session. The instructor went on to explain that over coming fear and anxiety by simply opening the door and taking that first step into

the karate studio kept countless potential students from beginning their journey. It is the first step of any journey that is the most important.

As we begin a new calendar year, both as individuals and as a church, we will in many ways be taking first steps on our journeys forward. This past year has been filled with a plethora of unexpected and devastating challenges. It is easy to feel as if we have been completely knocked off the path that we had been walking. We have been derailed by the pandemic, racial unrest, political divisions, and economic and cultural hardships. But like any good fighter, when you get knocked down, you get up, dust yourself off, and start pushing ahead again. That is what we will do as a congregation and a body of believers. We will move ahead again.

Jesus Christ is calling all of us, day after day, to 'follow him.' We are called just like the early disciples to leave our past journeys and step out onto a new path with Christ. As we do, Christ gives us a promise – that we will be transformed into gospel spreaders. We will be soul-harvesters and light sharers! ## Session News and Happenings from November and December

Your Session met via Zoom on November 17<sup>th</sup> and December 15<sup>th</sup>. Much of our time for these months was spent on how to adapt our ministries as we returned to On-Line Worship and Programming. Also, Session worked on finalizing our Stewardship Campaign and Budgeting Process for the year. Below are actions that Session has taken over the past two months:

#### Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Removal from Membership: Tanner Farrand and Zach Farrand. Report of Individual Communion being served on October 29<sup>th</sup> and Corporate Communion being served on November 1<sup>st</sup> and December 6<sup>th</sup>.

## Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> discussed and approved Budget for 2021 and <u>formally approved raises for our staff and terms of Call for Rev. Olmsted and Rev. Wundermachen.</u> Staff Annual Reviews will take place in January. Our Annual Meeting will be held in -person on January 31<sup>st</sup> following our Sunday Service. <u>Facilities/Grounds</u> reported that electrical work for our front lawn area has been completed and that the Christmas Lights were hung by the committee. The KC Lawn bid for snow removal was approved.

<u>Worship/Outreach</u> reported on how On-Line Only Worship has been going. They also talked on how the preparation for our Advent Services and ministries is going. The Search for the Nativity experience went well and the donated canned goods were delivered to the Salvation Army. *The Committee made the motion to return to In-Person Worship beginning Jan.* 24<sup>th</sup>, and it was approved by Session.

<u>Mission/Fellowship</u> allocated the rest of their monies to the following: \$1000 to NOROC; \$1000 to PDA; \$1000 to Hy-Vee Feed a Family; \$1500 to Salvation Army; \$1445.03 to Salvation Army Giving Tree.

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> reported on the success of the Drive Thru Halloween Candy Caravan Outreach for Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>. They also worked hard on transitioning the Christmas Pageant to a virtual experience as individually filmed parts of children and families were compiled together and presented on December 20<sup>th</sup>. The Gathering has been cancelled through May while there may be a few stand-alone events throughout the winter and the Spring. In-person Sunday School and Confirmation will begin again on January 24<sup>th</sup>.

The 4th Quarter Special Accounts Report from SA treasurer, Cindy Jayes, was approved.

The November Treasurer's Report from Church Treasurer, Phil Masse, was approved.

Our meeting was closed with prayer.

We are hoping to be able to return to our Bible Study some time this Winter/Spring. However, we currently believe that it is the safest course of actions to hold off on this for the time being. Please be looking for more information on when we can start meeting again.



#### Lunch Tray Program – Austin Public Schools - Be a Guardian Lunch Angel

During distance learning, all school children are being provided lunches for free. Children are scheduled to return to in-person learning on January 4<sup>th</sup>, but no one knows for certain. When they return, lunches will not be free.

Austin Public Schools has recognized there is a segment of the parent population who doesn't qualify for any help and just misses the eligibility for free and reduced lunches. These are the kids who are lost in the shuffle, they're the children whose families are working hard but just don't make enough to pay for a hot lunch. It takes about \$450 per child per year to provide hot lunches.

Please make an extra effort to support this project by bringing in your coins – we accept all coins. For 2020, the Penny Jar did not have many coins. Consequently, the coins were not taken to the bank, and the amount was not matched by PWC. PWC did, however, donate \$600.00 to the Lunch Tray Program.
