

Psalm 23:4

Tools of the Trade

We all have them. Carpenters and contractors carry a belt full of them. Businessmen and women carry briefcases with them neatly tucked away. Students and teachers carry backpacks overloaded with them. We all carry with us tools of our trades and activities. A collection of items that are essential to the task at hand. Without them, we would be useless and ineffective.

In the ancient near east, things were no different, certain tools were essential to their daily lives. For the Shepherd, these tools would have included a rod and a staff. Any decent and dedicated Shepherd would be lost without these two items. The rod, which in our vernacular we would call a club, served as a symbol of strength. It could be either thrown or swung in order to thwart off any predators or thieves that threatened the flock. The second tool the Shepherd would take with him, whenever out in the fields,

was the iconic staff. The long slender staff served as a symbol of care and compassion. The skilled shepherd would use his staff to gently guide, discipline, and draw back his sheep into their fold. The use and effectiveness of these tools were a direct indication of how skilled the shepherd was. A good shepherd would use these tools to lead his flock through the darkest of valleys and in the face of any evil that confronted them. Through these tools, the flock was comforted.

Our Good Shepherd does the same for all of us. We are led and protected by the rod that is God's Word. It is in the strength of the Living Word that we find our purpose and our calling as believers. In John 1, we are told that Jesus Christ is the Word of God and that the Light of that Word shines brightly amongst the darkness. Whatever darkness or evil you are walking through, it is the power and authority of the Living Word of God that brings you into the light. As you are protected by the rod, you are also guided by the staff that is God's Holy Spirit. Jesus told his disciples this in John 14:6, "And I will pray to the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may be with you forever." The Lord has sent us his Holy Spirit who is our comforter, our counselor, our helper. It is this spirit that will lead us, correct us, and draw us back into the sheepfold. It is through the power of God's Living Word and the care of the Holy Spirit that we can walk

through the fear, the pain, and the death of this world.

Our God will use these tools of faith to lead us into his presence and his future. The central fact of Shepherding remains, the closer the sheep are to the shepherd, the more they can live in his strength and protection and feel his peace and his care. Use the tools of our trade as believers – God's Word and God's Spirit – to remain in his comfort. Amen!

Session News

Session News and Happenings from November and December

Your Session met in person on November 16th and December 21st. Below are actions that Session has taken over the past two months:

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

The deaths of Charlie Lanchantin (11/11/21) and Duane Perry (12/1/21) were recorded. Corporate Communion was served on November 7^{th} and December 5^{th} . Individual Communion was served on December 14^{th} .

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> discussed the 2021 Stewardship Campaign results and began working on the 2022 Budget. Staff Annual Reviews will take place over late December and early January. Our Annual Meeting will be held in-person on January 30th following our Sunday Service.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> reported that water faucet installations are complete and that there is continuing work to be done on the Boiler.

<u>Worship/Outreach</u> reported that they are having a scaled-down version of The Festival of the Nativities, and they decided to have the Blue Christmas Service on December 19th. There was also discussion regarding how we should serve Communion in the coming months. The Committee made the motion to have people come forward to receive the Communion elements and then take them back to their pews so that we could return to the tradition of taking the elements together as one body and it was approved.

<u>Mission/Fellowship</u> reported that all of the allocated mission monies have been distributed for the year. They helped serve at the Chili Cook-Off on November 7th.

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> discussed the progress of the upcoming Christmas Pageant, and it was decided not to have the traditional Potluck Meal following the Pageant and to replace that with a time of Christmas Cookies and Cocoa. Discussion was had regarding the possible change of the 2022 Youth Mission Dates, and it was reported that the 2022 VBS would be from August $8^{th} - 12^{th}$. Rev. Olmsted will be leading an Adult Forum on his Sabbatical on Jan. 9^{th} , 16^{th} , & 23^{rd} , and there will be a New Members Class on February 6^{th} , 13^{th} , & 20^{th} . It was shared that Coleen Olmsted has been hired (as of 1/1/22) to serve as the Interim Children's Ministry Director through the Summer. *The motion was made to dissolve the CM Hiring Task Force, and this was approved.*

The 4th Quarter Special Accounts Report from SA treasurer, Cindy Jayes, was approved. The October and November Treasurer's Report presented by Co-Treasurer, Bill Momsen, were approved. Elected to the Nominating Committee as Vice Chair - Ann Sundal. Approved 4 extra paid vacation days for Pastor Britt - November 21-24, 2021.

Both meetings were closed with prayer and the singing of the Doxology.

Deacon News

November Meeting

We opened the meeting with a prayer and devotion. We were reminded that we are always in constant need of help from God and that we need to trust Him always. We need to thank God even during hard times.

We review our care lists each month and try to reach out to as many of our members as possible through cards, phone calls, and visits.

The deacons also discuss routine business, such as Sunday greeters, communion prep, assembling the Witness, and keeping the Welcome Table up to date.

Our meal ministry continues to help people with meals to those in need after surgery, during illness, or after birth. If you or someone you know might need meals, please contact Pastor Britt or contact one of our deacons.

December Meeting

Our December meeting opened with prayer, telling us to look to God in all moments and circumstances of our lives. We were reminded that we could always experience God's presence even though the world is unstable and full of turmoil.

We review our care lists each month to make sure all congregants are cared for. We monitor the changing Covid-related precautions at the nursing facilities and group homes as we try to visit and keep in touch with members.

Our routine business includes communion prep, welcoming newcomers to our church, organizing and assembling the Witness newsletter, and helping members with meals through our meal ministry. If you know of people who might need meals brought to them, please contact one of our deacons or Pastor Britt.

We also want to continue to help our food pantry as we think of ways to publicize and promote this free community outreach.

The deacon group is a very caring group of individuals who want to help others and always appreciate any input or suggestions.



Tuesday Morning Bible Study




