## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE

does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth.

#### 1 Corinthians 13:6

*"Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth."* 1 Corinthians 13:6

#### What's Your Guilty Pleasure?

A guilty pleasure is generally a song, a meal, or an activity that someone secretly enjoys but would not want other people to find out about it. Typically, a guilty pleasure is something that is mostly done in jest but that might be viewed as embarrassing by some. These types of pleasures are like eating that comfort food that you know is not the healthiest or reading that novel that walks the fine line between fluff and filth or singing loudly over and over again that pop song from the '90s. For the most part, our guilty pleasures are fairly harmless in nature and don't carry with them too many dire consequences.

Our passage from 1 Corinthians 13, the Love Chapter, addresses a different kind of guilty pleasure. By definition, these aspects of life are meant to satisfy our earthly desires and wants. On a spiritual basis, they can eat away at our faiths and cause us to be led down a path that ends in darkness. As Paul wrote about the idea of love to the Church in Corinth, which was embroiled in conflict and controversy, he clearly stated that love should always strive to overcome our sinful and evil natures. Paul came out of the Jewish religious tradition that was more concerned about the outward appearance rather than the inward condition. In fact, one of the criticisms leveled against Jesus and the early followers is recorded in Mark 7:5, "Why do your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" To this, Jesus responded by quoting from the Prophet Isaiah, "These people honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; in vain do they worship me teaching as doctrines the commandments of men." The simple truth is that without love, the words of our lips will be empty, the worship of our hearts will be in vain, and the doctrines and teachings of our minds will come from earthly commandments rather than from God.

It is love that enables us to reject our evil passions and embrace the Truth that comes from Christ. I believe it's a basic equation - the more we fill our lives with love, the less room there is for evil and sin to try to take hold of us. It is in loving our God and loving others that we turn from the lies of the world towards the Truth of our Lord. This type of love also does not slink around in the corners of our life, it joyfully takes center stage and boldly proclaims the truth. We as believers are not called to indulge in the evil desires of this world. We are called to stand firmly on the Word of God.

As we begin another year, let us allow our words, our worship, and our teachings to be centered on the love of our God. Let us rejoice in the Heavenly Truth rather then delight in this Earthly Evil. Go ahead and enjoy those harmless guilty pleasures, but let us not find pleasure in the lies and the temptations of the world in which we live. Let us mark 2023 with a visible and a felt expression of love, a love that is Christ focused and Christ inspired.




## LUNCH TRAY PROGRAM

MISSION UPDATE - Thank you to all who followed their heart and responded to the 2022 letter related to mission needs. We received communication from Reiser Relief for Haiti (a longtime Minnesota based mission) we have supported for several years. Due to Haiti's natural disasters, severe pandemic issues, poverty, and horrific, overwhelming crime rate, it has been difficult to ensure that any donations would reach the intended children's orphanages. The recent communication described banks are now able to open a few hours a week as they have restored electrical power. Funds can safely be sent and reach the intended mission. Donations were being accepted to provide the children with Christmas gifts of toothpaste and toiletries along with a small toy. Because of your donations \$500 was sent in December so the children would receive gifts THIS Christmas. YAAAY GOD!!

#### Session News and Happenings from November and December

Your Session met in person on 11/15 and 12/20. The meetings were opened with devotions and prayers from Pastor Olmsted. Below are actions that Session took over the past two months:

#### Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Baptisms Performed: Kayden Levai (11/13/22); Deaths: Judy Reul (11/29/22); Membership: Brooke Hamilton (ROF); Lord's Supper was served collectively on 9/4/22 & 10/2/22 and individually on 12/1 by Rev. Olmsted and Rev. Wundermachen to four members.

# Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

**Personnel/Finance** discussed the 2022 Stewardship Campaign results and began working on the 2023 Budget. Staff Annual Reviews will take place the first two weeks of January. Our Annual Meeting will be held in-person on January 29<sup>th</sup> following our Sunday Service. Session approved the formation of the Financial Vision Team to provide direction on the usage and oversight of the Hocker Fund. This task force consists of the following members: Nanc Lenz, Richard Carlson, Leanne Clasen, Jason Baron, Greg Vortherms, and Pastor Olmsted. Session also approved changing Committee Meetings and Session Meetings to 6:30pm for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesdays of the month respectively beginning in Feb., 2023.

**Facilities/Grounds** continued moving forward with plans for building a two -stall garage to replace our current shed. They are working on getting drawings and specifications from Arrow Building Center, and they requested that the P/F Committee begin looking at funding options for the project. Session approved renewing our Snow Removal Contract with KC Lawn and Snow and the approved the bid from Harty Mechanical to fix a backflow problem in our water pipes.

**Worship/Outreach** oversaw The Festival of the Nativities on 12/2-12/3 and the Blue Christmas Service on 12/18. The Chili Cook-Off was a great success. There was discussion regarding having a 'Movie Under the Stars' Outreach in Jan. or Feb. Session approved the facility usage for a Talent Show Fundraiser in March. The church will provide assistance as needed.

<u>Mission/Fellowship</u> reported that all of the allocated mission monies have been distributed for the year. They helped serve at the Chili Cook-Off on 11/13 and the Potluck on 12/18. Session approved an increase in the Mission Budget up to \$40,000 in 2023 and they approved our Unified Mission Support Pledge to PC(USA) of \$10,000.

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> oversaw the Christmas Pageant "Cookin' Up Christmas" and the Potluck following. Discussed the Adult Ed. options be offered and a New Members Class in Feb.

The 4th Quarter Special Accounts Report from SA treasurer, Cindy Jayes, was approved. The October and November Treasurer's Report presented by Co-Treasurer, Bill Momsen, were approved. A Board of Deacons size change from 15 members to 12 was approved.

Both meetings were closed with prayer and the singing of the Doxology.

We closed our meeting in prayer.

#### December

We opened our meeting with reading from our Advent Devotional *Love Reaches Down*. The Devotion talked about how God's love reaches down to us, we are forgiven and saved through God's mercy, and don't have to rely on our own attempts because God has fulfilled it for us.

We continued our meeting by reviewing our care list and hospitalization sheet. We discussed each of the people on our list, when they were reached out to, what other needs they might have, and to see if there was anybody we needed to follow up with.




