A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed... some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no roots.

Fertile Ground: The Rocky Road

Rocky Road, as an ice cream flavor, is something most of us love, but rocky roads of life are something most of us try to avoid. The rocky roads that we can face are things that often test and try us. They challenge our strengths, our support networks, our resources, and force us to examine whether or not we are on the right path. But most of all, rocky roads prevent us from laying down a root system in our lives that sustains and nourishes us through our lives. As much as we try to flourish, we are just unable to go deeper in our relationships and our faiths. We cannot penetrate the rocks beneath us, and so, our branches above us often wither and fade.

As we continue to explore the *Parable of the Sower* in Matthew 13, we now encounter a 'soil' that at first appears to be receptive to the seed of truth that the farmer is sowing. This seed quickly sprouts forth, but its roots have nothing to attach themselves to. The rocky ground is not porous enough to let the roots through, and so, the seeds wither and die. Christ later adds an explanatory note, "*The seed falling*

on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away." This rocky soil Jesus refers to is perhaps the most dangerous of all the other soil types for us as believers. On the outside, we can put forth a good exterior in which our lives appear to flourish. We appear to be successful in our jobs and careers, our families look like we are functioning well, and we participate in and are active in our faith. But then the storms of life arise, and all of that external 'joy' falls away because we have not fixed our roots to the one who saves and redeems. We are blown around by the winds of life because we have not allowed our roots to dive deeply into God's Word and God's Will. We are not promised a life free from the storms, but we are promised the one who can protect and save us from the winds and the waves.

In the famous Biosphere 2 Project, in the late 1980's, researchers constructed in the Arizona desert the largest closed ecological systems ever created. The project was meant to re-create an ideal ecosystem of plants and animals within a controlled environment. Eventually, the project would fail. One of the many reasons for this failure was that the trees and plants would spring up quickly but would soon fade and fall away before reaching maturation. They found that the reason for this was that there was little to no wind in the Biosphere. Because of the absence of wind, the foliage had no need for a strong root system. They grew quickly but could not support themselves. Without the outside stress of the storms and the inward strength of solid roots, the plants were doomed.

Such is true for all of us. God brings storms, and winds, and rain into our lives so that we will dive deep within him and anchor our roots to his Word and his Truth. The rocky roads will come, but it is only when we affix ourselves to our Savior that we will not only survive but we will learn to flourish. In this new year, create practices in your lives that will allow your roots to grow strong and firm. Commit yourselves to the path of our God and you will live a life that is full and rich and filled with true joy!







Session News

Session News and Happenings from November and December

Your Session met in person on 11/21 and 12/19. The meetings were opened with devotions and prayers from Pastor Olmsted. Below are actions that Session took over the past two months:

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Baptisms Performed: None; Deaths: None; Membership: Marc & Tracy Oleson (LoT); Vandy Newman (LoT); Lord's Supper was served collectively on 11/5/23 & 12/3/23 and individually on 10/30/23 and 12/19/23 by Rev. Olmsted and Rev. Wundermachen to four members.

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> oversaw the Christmas Pageant "Carriers of the Light." Discussed the Children, Youth and Adult ministries in the new year. Session approved \$1000 (coming out of Special Accounts) be given to the new painting and murals in Classroom #6 in the CYM Wing.

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> discussed the 2024 Stewardship Campaign results and began working on the 2024 Budget. Staff Annual Reviews will take place the first two weeks of January. Our Annual Meeting will be held on January 28th following our Sunday Service. Discussed funding for our upcoming property projects.

Facilities/Grounds reported that our outside electrical work has been completed, and they are waiting for equipment for the basement work. Work on our Boiler continues as we try to regulate heat throughout the facility. Discussed adding more accessible seating in the sanctuary. Session approved that both the W/O and F/G Committees begin discussion of how to improve our accessibility in the Sanctuary. Session approved renewing our Snow Removal Contract with KC Lawn and Snow. The Kitchen Door/Ramp Project was indefinitely tabled. Worship/Outreach oversaw The Chili Cook-Off on 11/12/23 and the Blue Christmas Service on 12/17. There was discussion regarding having a 'Movie Under the Stars' Outreach in Jan./ Feb.

<u>Mission/Fellowship</u> reported that all of the allocated mission monies have been distributed for the year. They helped serve at the Chili Cook-Off on 11/12 and the Potluck on 12/17.

Session approved the bid from Cathedral Arts to repair our Stained Glass Windows for a max. of \$80,000 (Half will come from the Faith Forward Fund (FFF) and half will come from a Congregational Appeal.) The purchase of a new Air Conditioner unit was approved for \$17,130 which will come from FFF. The 4th Quarter Special Accounts Report from SA treasurer, Cindy Jayes, was approved. The October and November Treasurer's Report presented by Co-Treasurer, Bill Momsen, were approved. The Endowment Fund Investment limitations were changed from a monetary amount to a percentage amount. A Facility usage agreement with Casa del Alfarero (The Potter's House) Congregation and their use of the Chapel on Saturday and Sunday Nights for worship was approved. This will begin immediately. A request from Living Bible Church for 10-15 hours of office space was tabled until January in order to explore possible liability and insurance issues.

Both meetings were closed with prayer by Rev. Wundermachen and the singing of the Doxology.




