Session News

Session News and Happenings from May & June, 2023

Your Session met on May 16th and June 20th. Each meeting was opened with prayer and a meditation on ministry was given. We explored what it means to give to the Great Multiplier and live out the message of the Loaves and Fishes. Below are the discussions and actions of Session that took place over the past two months:

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Membership: Removed from Membership Rolls (per their request) Beth and Lemoyne Anderson and their adult children Wendy, Tony, and Cathy. Rec'd Confirmands: Dax Boverhuis, Brooke Fisch, Asah Rapha Ngi. Received into membership: Russell Fisch (PoF). Baptism Performed: Asah Rapha Ngi (5/21/23 – BW). Baptism Requested: Lucas, Kirby, and Aubrey Coordes (7/2/23), Ila Mae Hernandez (8/20/23), Claire Sorenson (8/20/23). Deaths: Lonnie Houff (4/24); Sid Brown (5/30/23), Darlene Perry (6/16/23). Lord's Supper: Served corporately on 5/5/7/23 & 6/4/22; individually on 4/27/23.

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any Session Actions that were taken:

<u>Faith Forward Fund Task Force</u> presented their proposal of a renewed understanding and usage of what was formerly known as 'The Hocker Fund'.

Personnel/Finance approved a \$500 Educational Scholarship to our HS Seniors: Lydia Baron, Cameron Olson, Russell Fisch, Ben Diang, and Rachel Toland. Approved the renewal of our Property & Liability Insurance. The committee also received a letter expressing concerns with our financial reporting. This was reported to Session and corrections were made. The committee will also look into possible changes with our internal auditing.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> approved the removal of two large trees south of the porte cochere. The Fire Department came and inspected our facilities, and four minor violations were found. We are in the process of correcting these issues.

<u>Worship/Outreach</u> approved Summer Outdoor Worship for June 18th, July 16th, August 20th. Also approved making available Gluten-Free Wafers for our Communion Services. They scheduled Special Music for the Summer.

Mission/Fellowship They served the celebration treats on 5/21 and 5/28 and faithfully worked and served for the Vetslandslag 2023 and the VBS/All Church BBQ. They are planning for the 4th of July Ice Cream Social, the Community Corn and Pork Feed and Car Show Extravaganza on Wed., Aug. 23rd. They are keeping our Food Pantry filled on Wednesdays and Sundays. Discussed the Food Packing Event on 8/27.

Nurture/Discipleship reporting on end-of-year activities, VBS, and Summer Youth Events. In May, we welcomed in 3 confirmands into church membership with one receiving an Adult Baptism. Thanked all volunteers and staff for their extra work on VBS this year.

General Session Approvals: Approved the formation of the Property Projects Planning Task Force to consider possible property needs in the future. The FFF proposal was approved by Session on May 16th and was presented to the Congregation on June 11th. The FFF Task Force was officially disbanded by Session on June 20th. Session received with regret the resignation of Steve Rodewald as an Elder and we expressed our gratitude for his service. Approved April and May Treasurer's Reports.

Meetings were closed with prayer and the singing of the Doxology.
