"GROWING IN FAITH, REACHING OUT IN LOVE"

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him." (Luke 15:20)

Perhaps Jesus Christ's most poignant, most challenging, and most convicting parable is that of the Prodigal Son found in the 15th chapter of Luke's Gospel. This is the account of two sons both living under their own canopy of rejection, betrayal, and denial. The youngest son blatantly displays his own sense of 'lostness' as he demands his inheritance and leaves his Father's household to pursue his own dreams and desires. The older son, later in the story, reveals his 'lostness' through bitterness, jealousy, and moral superiority. Both sons have defiantly left their Father.

Our culture, and our churches, are more like these two sons than we would probably like to admit. Divisions between groups and ideals have led to a certain sense of 'lostness' for all. Regardless of the issue, there seems to always be one side being accused of a destructive self-centeredness while the other side boasts of their superior morals and ideals. And here's the crux of

the problem, regardless of how loudly one side shouts at the other, both 'brothers' have gone astray. Author and Presbyterian Pastor, Timothy Keller, writes that this story points to both sides and reveals their "blindness, narrowness, and self-righteousness." This parable proclaims loudly that all are lost and need to be found.

Keller continues, "Jesus's purpose is not to warm our hearts but to shatter our categories. Through this parable Jesus challenges what nearly everyone has ever thought about God, sin, and salvation." But as Jesus shatters our categories, he does not leave us in the midst of our own failures and waywardness. For on the hillside the Father waits. He waits and hopes for our return. Whether it is returning physically from a lifestyle of sin and disobedience or returning emotionally from a heart that has been hardened by selfishness and distrust, he waits and welcomes us all. To both sons he offers to lavish upon them his grace, his forgiveness, his acceptance, and his compassion.


I have recently been challenged to wonder "Why is God's church not more like the Father standing on the hillside?" Our calling as the Body of Christ is to draw and welcome the lost into the righteousness of our Lord. We, the Church, are to be the offering of acceptance and love so that all may feel the warm hillside embrace of our God in Heaven. We must resist the temptation to follow our own paths and desires as well as denying our own sense of status and accomplishment. As we embark on

a new season of ministry, let it be a season filled with, what Keller calls, "the foretaste of that future salvation (through) prayer, service to others, changes of the inner nature through the gospel, and the healed relationships that Christ can give us now." Let us all stand on the hillside in the loving arms of our Lord and welcome others to join. Amen!

APPLE SNACKS




These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

What you do:

1. Place apples slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
2. Place apples slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.

- ◆ Believe them when they trust you with their stories: encourage them to seek help.
- ◆ Make sure our church is available to provide educational programs.
- ◆ Establish policies and procedure, and think through how we will respond when someone comes to us for help.
- ◆ Attend community programs and training sessions provided by domestic violence services.
- ◆ Speak with or write to your legislative representative to ensure their support of laws that protect families from domestic violence.
- ◆ Pray.
