A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters;" Psalm 23:1-2

Practice the Pause

About three to four months ago, my wife said to me, seemingly out of the blue, "Mike, maybe you should consider the idea of a Sabbatical." Over our almost two decades here at Westminster, this idea of intentional rest has come up, but it has never really stuck. I always felt that things were good and that we would pursue this somewhere down the line. However, this time when I heard those words, it made me stop. It made me pause. This time I would not simply dismiss this notion. In fact, this idea of a sabbatical nestled into my heart and my mind, and it quickly grew. By the next day, I had laid out the framework for what my Sabbatical Leave would become. Of course, there was much work that was needed to be done researching, approaching our Presbytery and our Session, and as always, committing it to prayer. But I truly believe that God had put the right words into my wife's mouth at the

right time so that I would truly listen and respond. It was and is time for me to Practice the Pause!

Our psalmist speaks about this pause when he classically shares how the Good Shepherd MAKES us lie down. God knows when we need to rest. He sees when we need nourishment and restoration. Regardless of how crazy and hectic life is, our God has prepared green pastures and still waters for you and for me. He has given specific locations and specific times for rest, for renewal, for energy, and for strength. This amazing Psalm begins with the timeless perspective that our Shepherd will provide for us, and he will give us all that we need and want. Isn't it interesting that the first provision given is resting in fields that give nourishment and walking beside calm and serene waters that quench our thirst?

I recently saw this Facebook post (sent to me by...you guessed it, my wife) from the Southern Gospel group Ernie Haase and Signature Sound:

Practice the pause. When in doubt, pause. When angry, pause. When tired, pause. When stressed, pause. And when you pause, PRAY!

Practice the pause. That is my challenge for all of us in the coming weeks. As schools begin again, as the pace of life increases, as we return from our Summer cabins, as we re-engage with friends and neighbors, let's all be sure to pause. Let's together look for the moments in which we can rest and pray and read scripture and worship. These moments aren't always easy to come by, but scripture is clear that our God

will give them to us. He will create green pastures and still waters in our lives. We just have to be willing to stop and pause in order to see them and enjoy them. Let's all commit to practicing the pause together and receiving the blessings of what our Good Shepherd gives us. Amen!

Your Session met for a **specially called Session Meeting on Thursday, July 1**st and approved the following items: Serving of Communion at the Strobel/Holden Wedding on July 10th. Transfer of Membership of Jamie Huisken to WPC; Two male chaperones, Jason Baron & Caleb Wundermachen, who helped drive out and drive back for the Youth Mission Trip; Mike Taylor, from Gideon's Bible, to do Minute for Missions on August 22nd and take a free-will offering; Baptismal request for Arthur Waynn Davidson on August 8th (parents: Jesse and Lindsey Davidson).

Your Session met in person on August 17th. Below are the discussions and actions of Session that have taken place over the Summer:

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any Session Actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> is working with Rev. Olmsted on his Sabbatical and on supporting and encouraging Rev. Wundermachen during this time. Are in consultation with N/D regarding Children's Ministry Director Search. Approved wages increase for Office Assistant/Media Specialist and hour and wage increase for Children's Ministry Director. Approved Pastor Appreciation for Nov. 28th.

Facilities/Grounds approved bid from Harty Mechanical for \$10,000 to replace all drinking fountains. Worked with Morem's on the removal of two trees and the trimming of hanging branches. Will also be working on installing filters in kitchen faucets and toilets. Will begin placement of the WPC Free Community Food Pantry.

Worship/Outreach: Session approved ending Outdoor Worship on August 29th and worship indoors beginning on Sept. 5th. Continued discussion on new COVID Protocols. Preparing for the Free Corn & Pork Feed Community Outreach for 8/25 at 5:30pm.

<u>Mission/Fellowship:</u> Session approved the acceptance and placements of our New WPC Free Community Food Pantry. They will assist with serving the Corn & Pork Feed on Aug. 25th.

Nurture/Discipleship: Session approved the creation of a Children's Ministry Task Force to search for a new director. Are developing a plan for volunteers to lead Sunday School in the Fall. Pastor Britt introduced a new Youth Ministry structure.






