"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud." 1 Corinthians 13:4

Ouiet Please!!

There I was standing on the 7th Green at the TPC Twin Cities Golf Course with my arms extended upward ensuring that professional golfers such as Ricky Fowler, Stewart Cink, and Tony Finau would not be disturbed or distracted as they were putting for birdies, pars, and bogeys. If you've ever watched a golf tournament in person or on television, then you know the scene that I am describing. Well that was me this past month in Blaine, MN, as I volunteered as a Gallery Management Ambassador for the 3M Open Golf Tournament on the PGA Tour. It was a unique and fun experience as I was able to get 'inside' the ropes and enjoy the game I love in a different light. I had a great time, but there was also a purpose for me being there. That purpose as a 'purple shirted' volunteer was to serve both the golfers and the public. I wasn't there just to watch golf at a different level. I was there as a vital part of the functioning, both behind the scenes and out front, of this multi-milliondollar golf tournament.

As always, I look for spiritual

parallels of life, and I definitely found one at this tournament. Critical to the success of this event was how well the volunteers focused on caring for and serving the golfers and the people there watching them. For all the money that was poured into this event, I was amazed that at the core of this experience was the service and attention given by hundreds of volunteers. This same spirit is also at the core of our lives as believers and how we function as the Church of Christ.

Over the next few months. Pastor Britt and I will be writing about what many call the "Love Chapter" – 1 Corinthians 13. At the foundation of this amazing letter written to a church in the Greek City of Corinth, was this idea of love - a love that unites, that serves, that gives to both our God and others. We are familiar with the opening words in verse four where each item patience, kindness, envy, boastfulness, and pride – speaks to our relationship with our God and with humanity. In this arena of public life, the quality of experience that we have will be based on how well we commit to the enjoyment and the experience around us.

We are called as believers to live patiently and kindly with others. Let us not be pushy or confrontational or ill tempered. We are called not to let jealousy or pride drive wedges between ourselves and those around us. We must not be boastful or arrogant of the blessings that we have been given. The love that Paul is focusing on is an always giving, always caring, always surrendering sense of service and mercy. Whether we are volunteering on a golf course, interfacing with co-workers in the office, nurturing children at home, or having coffee with friends, we

must always do so with a sense of love that seeks the betterment of others over ourselves. So, as summer comes to end and our regular patterns of life are beginning again, let us commit to having *a love that is lived out*. Let us love with service, sacrifice, care, and compassion. Let us Love our God with all that we are and love our neighbors as ourselves.





Austin Public Schools Lunch-**Tray Project**

To qualify for the Free- and Reduced-Price Lunch program, families need to fall into specific income guidelines. To put this into perspective, a single parent with one child must gross less than \$2525 per month to qualify for free or reduced priced meals. That number is before taxes, insurance, transportation, housing, and all other life expenses that are accounted for. It is easy to see how school lunch money can become overwhelming. In Austin, there are a number of families whose income puts them outside these guidelines, but by such a small amount that paying for lunches is still a challenge.

To address this need, the Food & Nutrition Department at Austin Public Schools has launched the Lunch Tray Project, where interested citizens, businesses, and other entities can donate money to help pay for a year of lunches for students whose families fall into this group. Those families we are hoping to help are working families who, more than likely, do not qualify for any supportive services. They are families to whom this would be appreciated as a "helping hand," one which would take one worry off their plate.

An average year of lunches cost \$450 per student. To qualify for the Lunch Tray Project, students must have a Free & Reduced lunch application that has been denied based on income with the amount of denial less than the \$450 per student needed to pay for lunch.

Each year, there are approximately 20-40 children who would be helped by this program. All money raised will go directly into student accounts, as there is no extra cost to administer this program. We know that having healthy meals improves academic success for students. Austin is part of a program that allows us to provide all students with breakfast at no charge for this very reason. Now we're hoping to help families whose income puts them just outside the guidelines to provide their students with healthy lunches as well.

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Your Session met in person on August 16th. The meeting was opened with devotions and prayers from Pastor Olmsted. Below are the discussions and actions of Session that have taken place over the Summer:

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any Session Actions that were taken:

Personnel/Finance is working on a transfer of Treasurer's duties and responsibilities. We welcomed to our staff Laura Carlson (CM Director) and Jim Jayes (Asst. Custodian). Formally tabled discussions on WPC Employee Classification until Sept. Committee Meeting. Facilities/Grounds approved bid from Berg's Nursery of up to \$1,000 to clean and treat east side patio blocks to reduce weed growth. Reported that the oven has been repaired and is working well, and the committee spent lots of time working on the outside grounds. We also finished cleaning out all of the Boy Scouts equipment from our basement.
