# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"A Farmer sowed his seeds into his fields." Matthew 13:3

Over the next few months, Pastor Britt and I will be writing in these Witness Messages about one of Jesus Christ's most powerful and poignant parables. It is the Parable of the Sower in which a farmer begins casting his seeds across his fields in the hope that they will produce a wonderful crop for the harvest. We will be reflecting on the four different types of soil that the seeds are cast upon – The Hardened Path, the Rocky Road, the Thorny Patch, and finally, the Receptive Soil. There will be the obvious parallels between the ground of the fields and the hearts of humanity, but there will also be the subtle understanding of what we must do to prepare ourselves to receive God's Word and God's Love. As is the hope of most of Christ's stories, we will be challenged to ask, "Which type of Soil am I?"

As we begin, we must first be reminded of the simple truth of this story - that all of this originates with the Farmer, our Father in Heaven. He is the one who casts out the seeds. Nothing of eternal value grows in this world that does not first come from God. He is the one that spreads truth, hope, and mercy throughout his creation. His casting is not limited to certain 'climates or conditions.' He shares all that he is with all of us. There is no selectivity in the process, and there is also no randomness in it either. Every soil type, every heart condition, is given the Word of God. This is how much our God loves us. Even though he knows that some of the seeds will not take and crops will not grow, he still shares his glory with us all. This is the first truth of this parable – God's love is given to all.

The second truth is that we must prepare our hearts so that we can receive this love. We are active participants in this production in the fields. We play a role. Simply put, in order for the Word of God to produce fruit in our lives and in the world, we must be in the soil preparation business. We must prepare our hearts and our minds to welcome home the presence, the grace, and the truth of our God. We cannot harden our soil by building up fences and hiding behind barriers of disobedience. We cannot live a life of faith on the surface in which we establish no roots of prayer, worship, and devotion. We cannot allow the weeds of our worries and the thorns of our treasures to choke us lifeless with lies and deceitfulness. Let us be the soil that receives God's blessings with open arms. Let us live with thanksgiving in our hearts as we embrace God's calling in our lives. Let us listen to his Word and engage in Worship, Fellowship, and Service. As we do, we will reap the promised harvest thirty, sixty, or even hundreds more than what was sown.

So, as summer comes to an end and our regular patterns of life are beginning again, let us commit to tending to the fields in our lives. Let us drink deeply the nourishing waters of our God. Let us fill up on the nutrients of faith and grace. Let us produce unending fields of the crops of love, sacrifice, care, and peace. This Fall, let us prepare our hearts to do the work of our God.


Rainbow Ringers, our handbell choir for children



<u>Presbyterians Against Domestic</u> <u>Violence Network</u> "If people of faith will not speak out against sexual and domestic violence against women and children, who will?" DOMESTIC ABUSE AWARENES MONTH

- Establish policies and procedure, and think through how we will respond when someone comes to us for help.

- Speak with or write to your legislative representative to ensure their support of laws that protect families from domestic violence.






