A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE

A Message from Pastor Mike Reconnecting!

I have always thought of Spring as a time to reconnect, and now this sense of connection is more needed than ever. With the weather beginning to change, we are now able to get outside and reconnect with nature by taking walks, planting gardens, and enjoying God's creation. With the vaccine being spread and restrictions being lessened, we are able to slowly and safely reconnect with our neighbors and our community. With the Lenten Season now upon us, we are able to reconnect with our church and our God through worship, prayer, fellowship, and scripture. Our theme this Lenten Season is 'Never Alone' and as the Christian Author and Speaker Max Lucado says, "You are stronger than you think, because God is nearer than you know." We will be drawing on this strength to help us reconnect as the body of Christ. To do so, I want to make three suggestions for all of us to try in these next few weeks.

Listen First, Speak Second.


As we return to God's presence, we must become spiritual listeners. Too often, we see God as the one who should listen to us. We spew forth all of our requests, needs, and wants, and we rarely take time to listen. We are called to "be still and know that He is God" but this is difficult to do when we speak first and listen second. This season, we need to slow down. Find time to sit quietly with God in scripture, in prayer, and in meditation. Seek to quiet both your heart and your schedule and

listen to what God wants to tell you. When you do, he will fill your hearts and your heads with his word and his truth.

Go Deeper. It is too easy most times to live life on the surface, never diving too deeply into anyone or anything. But this shallow approach to life leaves us unfulfilled and unsatisfied. Our God wants us to dive deep into his strength, his truth, and his will. Let's stop testing the water in the shallow end of the pool and begin to jump into the deep end. Commit to regular times of scripture reading, use our church devotional as a spring board into a more meaningful relationship with Jesus, re-watch our worship services on-line, or begin journaling your faith and your journey. Make time and find ways to go deeper, and as you do, vou will live a richer and fuller life.

Walk Closer. In the 1st Century, if you wanted to become a follower of a Rabbi or a Teacher, you were expected to physically walk behind this individual 24 hours a day listening and learning as you went. You would literally follow so closely behind them that you were to walk in and be covered by the dust of their feet. How closely are we walking behind Christ these days? Are your steps his steps? Are your paths his paths? Are your actions his actions? To reconnect with our God, we must follow him so closely that his priorities become ours. To follow Christ, we must be like Christ!

As we reconnect as believers and as friends, I encourage us all to do



so with a renewed purpose and passion. The time is right for the church and for followers of Christ to reach out again to the world and to begin drawing all of us together in the presence of our Lord. It is time to remind ourselves that we are Never Alone!

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> conducted Annual Reviews for Pastors and Staff.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> began working on possible church projects for 2021. They will continue getting bids for Tuck Pointing the exterior bricks and are getting estimates on doing some repair work on our stained glass windows.


