A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"Surely Goodness and Mercy will follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Psalm 23:6 Our Forever Home

Over the last few years, the number of Home Improvement Shows on Television and the Internet have skyrocketed. Shows like Fixer Upper, Love It or List It, Home Town, and Flip or Flop have exploded in popularity. These clever and resourceful home designers show us homes transformed before our eyes and lives changed in the process. They can be both inspirational and addicting. But what amazes me about these programs, and I think new home buyers in general, is that people are always looking for their Forever Home – a home in which their families will live forever in an idealized home environment. It seems like everyone is looking for that perfect house in that perfect neighborhood at that perfect price. Based on the ratings these shows get, it is apparent that our culture and society has become fixated on finding that ideal living place. The problem is that while we are searching for that elusive residence of perfection here on earth, we forget that our ultimate home is found in God's Kingdom.

Jesus tells his followers in John 14, "In my Father's House there are many rooms, and I will go and prepare a place for you." (Now if only Entertainment Executives would create a show based on that type of Home Improvement.) It is clear that Jesus is personalizing the message that our Psalmist shared in the final verse of the 23rd Psalm - "I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." King David's culminating thought in this inspirational Psalm is the one verse that should provide us with the most hope. As we have explored this wonderful Psalm together, we have been encouraged, strengthened, and guided by our Good Shepherd. We have received the abundant blessings of his provision and protection. Session News and Happenings from March and April

Your Session met March 15th and April 19th. For our opening Forum, we are spending some time exploring the theme for the year, "Love Lived Out," and the scripture Matt. 28:16-20. These past two months, we spoke on "Going Out" and "Making Disciples."

Below are the discussions and actions of Session that have taken place over the past two months:

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Deaths: Clark Toland (2/3/22); Dick Robinson (2/28/22); Howard Nepp (3/13/22)

Membership: Gordon & Terry Briggs; JoAnne Clark; Erna Dalen; Lamonte & Julei Gray; Rollie & Lola Hanson; Jamie Huisken; Lanny & Karen Krachmer; Eileen Lysne; Joe & Katherine Pacovsky, Dwayne & Stephanie Wilkinson; Pam deLeon.

The Lord's Supper was served in Worship on March 2nd, March 6th, April 3rd, April 14, and at the Symbolic Supper on April 13th.

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> met with our RBC Account Manager and is continuing discussions on use of Hocker Fund. In April, we approved diversification efforts in regards to our Hocker Fund (No more than 10% a year until we reach 50% of Hormel Stock ownership). We also approved adding our new Treasurers and Elder to our RBC Account.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> discussed the boiler condition and delt with the Sanctuary Lighting Issue. Scheduled the Church Spring Cleaning Up day for April 28th at 4:30pm. Requested a bid from KC Lawncare for our mowing. *Approved purchasing and installing another AED Machine*.

<u>Worship/Outreach</u> reviewed how Lent and special music went and are beginning to recruit music for the Summer. Rev. Olmsted shared his sermon themes for the Spring and Summer. Approved having Summer worship outdoors on 3rd Sunday of each month. Approved returning to pre-Covid service of Communion in the Fall (as long as it is safe to do so.) Approved a policy to require people wear gloves but no masks when serving and preparing food. Approved MNATC joining us for worship on March 19th, 2023.

<u>Mission/Fellowship</u> discussed the Free Food Pantry usage, the Lenten Meal on April 6th, and the request for funds for the Community Learning Center new program "Messy Boxes." This request was denied. *\$1,500 was allocated to Salvation Army*. <u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> reviewed the Easter Adventure and thought it went great. Discussed end-of year-aspects for S.S., Confirmation, and Youth Ministries. Approved and collected One Great Hour of Sharing Offering (4/10). Approved allocation of \$600 each to our three Graduating HS Seniors from the Amdahl Fund. Decided that food for the End-Of-Year BBQ be prepared in house and not have it be a potluck.

The March and April Treasurer's Report from Church Co-Treasurers, Bill Momsen and Eric Potter, were approved.

Our meetings were closed with prayer.

Deacon News

March meeting

We watched the first session of our Virtual Officers Retreat and talked about the act of going. This is vital to our ministry as it requires action. We realize as deacons, we are part of the hands and the feet of Christ, which means we actively seek people who might need care and people whom we can love and share the goodness of God.

April meeting




