A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MIKE



"Love never fails."

Corinthians 13:8

Love Wins!!

The sense of failure is rampant in our world. Go to any school, any ballfield, any place of employment, any family, and you will find that the majority of what we do, if not all, revolves around our fear of failure. It has been instilled in us from a very young age to achieve, to succeed, and to win. But what happens when that success or that victory does not come – we are labeled failures. When the message is as unbalanced as it has become in our world - striving, winning, achieving become the all-important goal. Which has created in all of us almost a primal fear of failure.

What does failure mean to you? What does failure look like to you? How do you define failure? The dictionary definition of failure is falling short of an image, hope, destination, value or required action. We all loosely understand the term, but in so many ways, our practical perception of failure varies drastically. In a quest to understand a current definition of failure, I recently texted of few of our members and asked simply, "what does failure mean to you?" Here are a few of the responses: failure is letting yourselves down; not trying; never standing up for myself; not living up to my expectations or that of others; turning

our face and heart away from God in shame. From these answers, it is easy to see that failure is understood in the context of performance. If you do not do well enough, then you fail and are counted as a failure. The painful reality is that we do not have to look very far to see the devastation that this mindset has caused in our world.

However, in the responses, I also received some thoughts that challenged this idea of failure: Victory is rooting our minds in scripture and fighting back against the negativity with God's Word; serving God by laving down our lives through a sacrificial lifestyle; allowing God to turn our failures into opportunities to share his grace. This is what Paul is speaking of in his final statement regarding love – it does not fail. Failure cannot co-habitat with love. For in love, we have victory. Another response that I received summarized this well, "When we feel failure thrust a thorn in our side, we have the opportunity to pour love over the wound." It is the love of our God that acts as soothing balm that negates the pain of being called a failure. As we strive for the love of our Savior, then we realize that his love does not fail.

I want to challenge all of our thinking regarding failure. While it is true that we all will fail in things that we do, it is not true that we are failures. You are a child of the unfailing love of our God. Jeremiah 31:3 says this, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness. I will build you up again, and you, Virgin Israel, will be rebuilt." In spite of what the world tells us, Love Wins!! So go forth, live in this love and sharing this love with others so that everyone can hear that "they are NOT a failure!"







We have been able to use this fund to engage in some limited church projects, but it's primary purpose has been to generate income to support our annual operating budget. However, the underlying purpose of this gift has always been to support and grow both the ministry and mission of our congregation.

In light of this, our Session developed a Task Force in December 2022 to determine how to properly understand this Fund and how to begin using it to '*Grow in Faith and Reach Out in Love.*' This task force has concluded their work and Session has agreed to their proposals and now we want to share the results with all of you.

<u>On Sunday, June 11th, as part of and as an extension of our Sunday Morning Worship</u> <u>Service, we will formerly present to our congregation our new Faith Forward Fund.</u> We will present the approved recommendations and share with you what this means for our congregation as we move forward. Overall, the direction forward will honor the spirit and value of the original gift for the ministry and mission of Westminster. It will advance our work as the Church of Christ in the furtherance of the Kingdom of God. and it will continue to provide for the longterm financial stability of this congregation.

We will be providing you with more information on this Sunday Celebration in the coming weeks but mark June 11th on your calendars and join us as we all move forward in our faiths!!

Session News and Happenings from March and April

Your Session met on March 21st, on April 18th for our regularly called Session Meetings, and on March 7th and April 13th for a Specially Called Session Meetings to approve a Love Offering for MNATC and to vote on the Concrete Driveway, Overhang, and Garage/Storage Project respectively. Opening prayers and devotions were given by Rev. Olmsted relating to our Officer's Retreat theme – *Loaves* and Fishes.

Below are the discussions and actions of Session that have taken place over the past two months:

Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

Deaths: Doris Schneider (03/10/23); Baptisms: Bennett Michael Gabbert (4/23/23); The Lord's Supper was served in Worship on March 5th and April 2nd, and on April 5th (Symbolic Supper) and April 6th (Maundy Thursday)

Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any actions that were taken:

<u>Personnel/Finance</u> met with our Co-Treasurers regarding having a more access to our funds in order to cover unforeseen expenses. Session approved moving some of the funds to Margin Accounts. Much discussion was had over the "Garage Project" and via a paper ballot vote, this project was denied.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> presented the bid for the Garage Project. No vote was taken in March as Session asked the committee for a list of Prioritization of current and future Building Projects as well as a Detailed Project Breakdown List with associated costs. Session Approved the Electrical Upgrade Project for \$48,902 with Austin Electric. Also approved the Bid for lawncare with KC Lawncare.

<u>Worship/Outreach</u> oversaw the implementation of the Austin Community Variety Show on March 25th. They helped select the special music for our Lenten Vespers Services. *Approved having 3 Outdoor Services this Summer (6/18, 7/16, & 8/20)* <u>Mission/Fellowship</u> oversaw the Fellowship events of MNATC Sunday Brunch (3/19) and the Variety Show Snacks (3/25). Approved the following Mission Monies: VBS -\$1,000; Rev. David Yoon & VOWE 37 - \$2,000; MN Adult & Teen Challenge - \$2,000; Vanessa Krell with YWAM -\$1,000; PCUSA Missionary Cathy Chang - \$1,000; and Rachel's Hope - \$1,000.

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u> oversaw the Easter EGGs-traordinary Adventure on April 8th in which we had over 350 in the building enjoying a great morning. Discussed an appropriate participation fee for VBS, decided to offer a HS Sunday School Class similar to Beyond the Pulpit, and Emma Evans-Peck is considering offering free guitar lessons to our youth.
