A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BRITT



He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. - Psalm 23:3

I see this word “restore,” and vivid imagery comes to mind. My husband had worked several years on restoring a house. This house, due to neglect, was falling apart and in shambles. People regarded it as an eyesore and had it scheduled for demolition. It took someone with a vision to see past the brokenness and restore the house to its former glory.

I think this can be true of us. We are broken, we neglect certain things in our lives that would be beneficial: rest, prayer, reading scripture. We fall into bad habits, and our lives can fall into shambles. We can ignore it in ourselves for a while, and we can see others lives in disarray and ignore what we see. But, we have an amazing God who sees past our brokenness. He has a vision for what we can be at our best

and so looks past our worst. Thus, he restores our souls. He brings us back to life. He reawakens us to love and joy.

And then he leads us in paths of righteousness for his name. He shows us how to live in a way of service and love to others. We are called to live differently from the world, in a manner worthy of God. To live holy and faithfully filled with love.

As we enter into our Stewardship Season, we strive to continue to live out God’s love for others. We see how God’s love is enveloped in mercy, kindness, and care. Items Approved in our Clerk's Report:

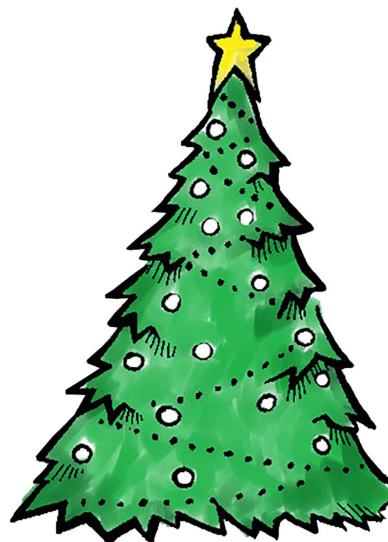

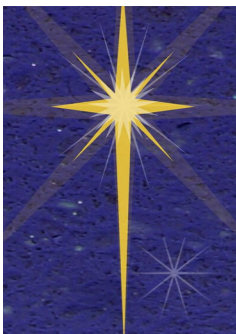

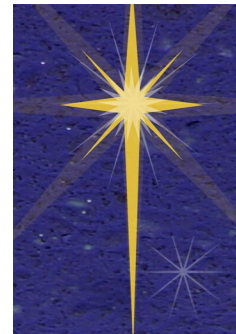
