A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BRITT



It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs." (1 Corinthians 13:5)

Love forgives. Isn't that the heart of the message we have in the Gospel, that through Jesus Christ we are forgiven? I remember sitting in the pews as a teenager, and while I don't remember all of the different prayers of confession we might have recited over the years, the assurance of pardon's refrain, 'through Jesus Christ we are forgiven' still echoes in my ears.

As I read these words from 1
Corinthians 13:5, I am reminded of how love forgives. This famous passage we know as the "love" passage is often read at weddings. They hold a beautiful vision of what this covenant life is like. Yet, often it can feel like we fall short in these areas. I look at each of these four examples of what love is not in this passage and am reminded of how I have not lived into that in some way over the years. I

especially am condemned by that last part, "it keeps no record of wrongs."

As a society, we can want things to be fair; we'll hold onto past grudges because we don't feel like we've received justice when we've been wronged; we'll tally up the ways someone has wronged us, and even after they've apologized, we still might not give it up. Imagine how exhausting this is for our hearts and souls, to focus on these hurts that have been heaped upon us over the years.

But then as we approach this Advent Season, we see how Love reaches down. God came as this helpless child. God, the only one who can really claim being wronged, keeps no records of our wrongs. He came down to love us, to forgive us, and to save us. It's a blessing that our Creator shows love in this way.

None of us are perfect, but we can certainly strive to live out the love that God has shown us. Especially as we pray it every week in church during the Lord's Prayer, "forgive us our debts, as we forgive out debtors." God forgives us freely and abundantly, his love can be a powerful force in our lives. When we really internalize that he forgives, we are more freely able to forgive others, thus sharing God's love.







Austin Public Schools Lunch-Tray Project

To qualify for the Free- and Reduced-Price Lunch program, families need to fall into specific income guidelines. To put this into perspective, a single parent with one child must gross less than \$2525 per month to qualify for free or reduced priced meals. That number is before taxes, insurance, transportation, housing, and all other life expenses that are accounted for. It is easy to see how school lunch money can become overwhelming. In Austin, there are a number of families whose income puts them outside these guidelines, but by such a small amount that paying for lunches is still a challenge.

To address this need, the Food & Nutrition Department at Austin Public Schools has launched the Lunch Tray Project, where interested citizens, businesses, and other entities can donate money to help pay for a year of lunches for students whose families fall into this group. Those families we are hoping to help are working families who, more than likely, do not qualify for any supportive services. They are families to whom this would be appreciated as a "helping hand," one which would take one worry off their plate.

An average year of lunches cost \$450 per student. Each year, there are approximately 20-40 children who would be helped by this program. All money raised will go directly into student accounts, as there is no extra cost to administer this program.

We know that having healthy meals improves academic success for students. Austin is part of a program that allows us to provide all students with breakfast at no charge for this very reason. Now we're hoping to help families whose income puts them just outside the guidelines to provide their students with healthy lunches as well.

<u>Facilities/Grounds</u> Working on water condition of toilets and sinks with Harty Mechanical and waiting for our new phones to come in. Approved and completed the refurbishment of the Kitchen Overhang. Received Session approval to develop plans and to begin receiving bids for the construction of a 2 Stall Garage on property.

Worship/Outreach: Discussed the upcoming Chili Cook-Off and Festival of the Nativities. Session reversed a previous approval and voted to continue have people come forward for Communion; approved the purchasing of a 2nd Sanctuary Camera and the development of a Supplemental Contemporary Hymnal.

<u>Mission/Fellowship:</u> Session approved their request for increasing 2023 Mission Budget to \$40,000 (funds will be taken from Hocker Fund) Approved these allocations: MNA/TC - \$800; Real Hope for the Hungry &1,000; YWAM – Vanessa Krell \$500; United Way Coat Drive \$500; PDA Hurricane Ian \$800; World Mission – Trevin & Ruthie Hoot \$500; Youth For Christ \$800.

Nurture/Discipleship: Discussed Fall Ministries and began planning for Candy Caravan (10/31) and Christmas Pageant (12/18).

Session voted on and approved the following: Approved the Aug. & Sept. Treasurer's Report as well as the May-August Special Accounts Report. Meetings was closed with prayer by Pastor Wundermachen and the singing of the Doxology.

Deacon News

September

We opened our meeting with a Devotional from *You* are the Beloved by Henri Nouwen. We read about how *God* is Mercy. We see that we have to turn our hearts toward God remembers his mercy for us and sharing that with others. We need to let God love others through us.

We always reflect on those that might be able to use a meal after a surgery, procedure, birth, death, or through other illness.

Our Communion Preparation and Westminster Witness Committee continue to plan and organize and set up for their respective ministries. We're so thankful that with their help, Communion and the Witness are always assembled and ready for us to receive.

This month, we heard from Betsy about a small booklet of scriptures that our Deacons can use as a resource for those who are sick. It is called *God's Creative Power for Healing*, by Charles Capps. It is filled with scriptures that people can pray regarding illnesses they might have. We want to empower our Deacons to help others with fruitful resources.




