

"GROWING IN FAITH, REACHING OUT IN LOVE"

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BRITT



Matthew 13:19 "When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path."

This is a passage I have wrestled with at various times, but the more you read it, the more your perspective can change. There are many things I don't understand, and so originally when I read this, I would be disheartened. It was saying to me that my lack of understanding was going to lead to "the evil one snatching away what was sown" in my heart. How terrible! But I know God wouldn't be that harsh. Our God is a God of love, and so that word "understands" must be something a little different than what I originally thought.

Then I looked to another of the words in that passage, "hears." When I focus on that, it changes. In our world today, we "hear" a lot. We take in so much information on a daily basis. Whether it is from radio, television, newspapers, books, or social media. We are constantly being bombarded with messages of the world. What we do with these messages will shape the trajectory of our lives. Do we accept them without any examination of their source or truthfulness? If so, then we are being blown about, grasping onto every new thing we hear. Do we ignore them completely? Then we might become misinformed and unwilling to change or adapt. Do we try to understand them and incorporate them into our lives? God sows his words in our hearts, but we must respond. We must take these words and understand that we are beloved, that we are saved, and that the good news must be spread.

Knowing we are beloved by God will change everything about how we live. Hearing this message and taking it to heart will affect how we act and what we say. It will lead us to greater understanding and growth in our own lives as we know how God has impacted us and led us into victory. But if we don't respond, if we don't seek to understand how God is working, then it will be as the passage says, "the evil one takes away the seed that was sown."

In a month, we will be heading into the Advent Season. We will be hearing the message of Jesus' birth. We will read scriptures and see how people sought him out, although we don't need to wait for Advent to know that the seed has already been sown in our heart. What we need to do is make sure that the seed God planted is being nourished. We need to make sure that we are responding to God's message.

As we continue on this journey, let us open our hearts to God's word. Let us be transformed by his love and mercy, and let us share his love with others.



Items of Discussion coming from our Committees and any Session Actions that were taken:

<u>Nurture/Discipleship</u>: Presented plan and schedule for changes to our Confirmation Class as well as added a Youth Sunday Class. Shared on upcoming Faithful Family Events and Adventurer's Club. Discussed Fall Ministries and began planning for the Candy Caravan (10/31) and Christmas Pageant (12/17). The Confirmation Class served at the Salvation Army on Sept. 14th.


